


- **Geronimo**

Anthropologist and activist who documented the lives and cultures of Native Americans in the early 20th century.




- **D'Arcy McNickle**

- **N. Scott Momaday**


Kiowa writer and poet who won the Pulitzer Prize for his novel "House Made of Dawn" in 1969.

Muscogee Creek poet and musician who served as the United States Poet Laureate from 2019 to 2022.


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
