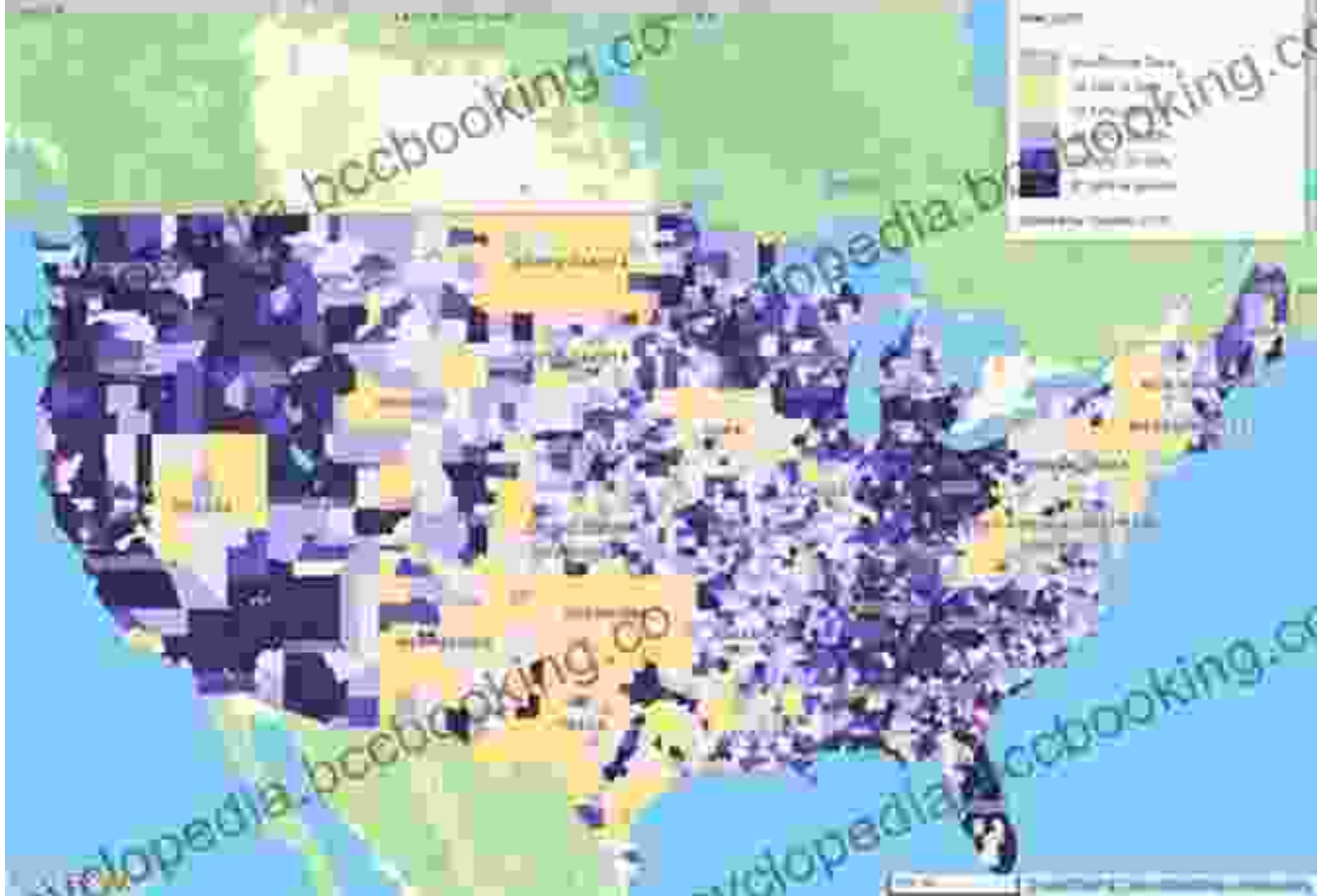
Percent change in median sales price for single family homes from 2014 to 2019.

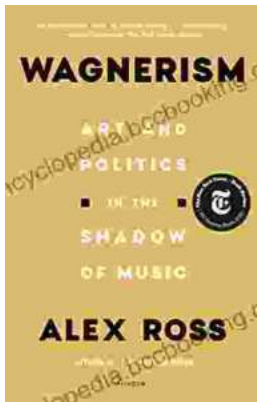

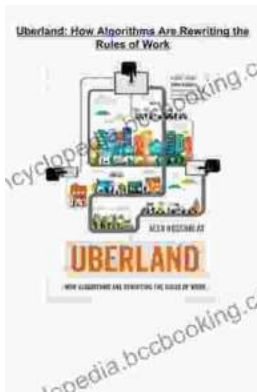
